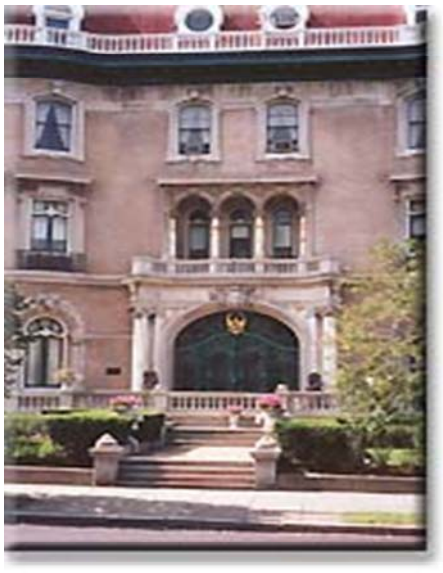

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Embassy Row is located on Massachusetts Avenue, and its surrounding neighborhood. The short stretch between Scott Circle and Sheridan Circle through DuPont Circle was once known as Millionaires Row. Washington DC hosts more than 170 foreign embassies, with about 60 on Massachusetts Avenue. New Hampshire Avenue and International Drive host 15 embassies each. The Islamic Center on Embassy Row is a unique building, which houses a mosque and educational facilities. It was built in the 1940s and 1950s with donations from all the Islamic countries of the world. Another interesting structure is the US Naval Observatory, home of the Vice President since 1974.
