Sandy Feldman will meet you in the Beau Rivage Lobby at 9:50 a.m. and from there we depart via private bus for a 45 minute ride to the quaint bay-side town of *Old Bay St. Louis*. Our first stop will be the Historic L & N Train Depot, a two-story, mission-style depot that was built in 1928 and is surrounded by park-like grounds. It is a "Mississippi Landmark", and was the heartbeat of the County and the backdrop for the classic Tennessee Williams film, *"This Property is Condemned"* starring Robert Redford, Natalie Wood and Charles Bronson. This area was the first business district to be revived after Hurricane Katrina. After greetings from the Hancock County Tourism Director, we'll board our bus *with our tour guide for a 1-hour tour of the lovely little town*. Lunch will be at **200 North Beach** where we'll enjoy waterfront dining with a great view of Old Town Bay. After lunch, everyone is on their own for an hour of shopping in the boutiques/shops on main street. *Back to the hotel by 3:30 p.m.* **Cost including transportation, lunch, tax & tip: \$67.00 per person.**

Biloxi, Mississippi



Biloxi, (pronounced bi-lux-i) is an Indian word meaning “First People.” Biloxi is the oldest continuous settlement on the Gulf Coast and the third-largest city in Mississippi. When Pierre LeMoyne Sieur d’Iberville met the Native Americans who called themselves Biloxi, he gave their name to the area and to the bay. Since its discovery, eight flags have flown over the city including the French, English, Spanish, West Florida Republic, Mississippi Magnolia, Confederate State, Mississippi State, and the United States. The French constructed Fort Louis here. It served as the capital of the Louisiana Territory from 1720 until 1722, when the capital was moved to New Orleans.
